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Personalized medicine and genetic research rely on access to large numbers of biospecimens from tissue banks. The challenges of creating and maintaining tissue banks are well recognized. This full-day program will consider how these challenges have been affected by the growing literature regarding participants' request for transparency and even control; recent legal cases such as the Havasupai settlement, the handling of neonatal blood spots and Catalonia; as well as the recent book regarding the development of the HeLa cell line. This workshop will discuss the potential impact of these issues and events. This is an advanced workshop, and there will be limited review of the basic paradigm for tissue banking oversight.
